

Wellington Mills Community Park



The Wellington Mills Community Park is located on the Wellington Mills Road in the heart of the scenic Ferguson Valley just 1 km North West of Gnomesville. It is the result of many hours of community volunteer involvement resulting in the reforestation of two hectares of land which up until 2008 was a pine plantation and prior to that was occupied by the original Wellington Mill town site that grew up around the jarrah timber mill.

Experiencing the universal (disability access) Nature Trail will take you on a virtual tour through this historic town site and as you walk, the ten interpretative signs and accompanying images will uncover the story behind this historic community and how the land came to be the restored natural flora and fauna landscape it is today.



How the Mill town was born, its survival of the fire, the laying of the railway line and how the community lived a 'simply rich' life will be just some of the stories you will read. Start at the Trail Head sign on Wellington Mills road and the Nature Trail will guide you for the duration of its 300 metres to include the meandering Ferguson River.

There are picnic tables across the Ferguson River and please be mindful of running water. In the heart of the Park there is a shelter and a free gas BBQ facility which is open for public use. The public are asked to take their rubbish with them and public toilet facilities are available.
